The entire month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. This month-long observance is largely due to the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, celebrated on 7th October.

According to legend, Mary entrusted the Rosary to St. Dominic in the 13th century.

Saint Dominic (1170–1221) was a Castilian Catholic priest and the founder of the Dominican Order. He is the patron saint of astronomers and natural scientists, and he and his order are traditionally credited with spreading and popularizing the rosary.

Our Friends Association has kindly agreed to purchase Rosaries for all the children. In class the children will be learning how to pray the Rosary, please support them at home to share what they have learnt with you. 
Thank you for your generosity with our Harvest food collection we will continue to take donations until the 21st of October.

Is your child eligible for this award - Free School Meals?

In order for the school to receive the Pupil Premium funding, a parent/carer must be claiming one of the following benefits:

- Income Support / Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) Universal Credit.

Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get). **Further information can be found on** https://www.essex.gov.uk/free-school-meals

New secondary admission round (Year 6 to 7 transfer September 2025)

The application period for admission to Year 7 in secondary schools for September 2025 opened on Thursday,12 September 2024.

From this date, parents/carers of current Year 6 Essex resident children will be able to make their applications using our website www.essex.gov.uk/admissions. Last year, 99% of Essex parents applied online.


As usual, the Council will not be sending out letters to parents/carers about applying. All of the application information is published on the website above.


